

Massimo Egidi was born in Gassino Torinese (Torino) in 1942. He graduated with a degree in physics at the University of Turin (Torino) in 1966.

Rector of the University of Trento from 1996 to 2004, Massimo Egidi is professor of Economics at the University of Trento since 1987. He is also the Director of the Computable and Experimental Economics Laboratory (CEEL) that was founded in co-operation with the Center for Computable Economics of the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) run by Professor Axel Leijonhufvud, currently a professor at the University of Trento.

Massimo Egidi has published several articles in national and international publications, and has been "Associated Editor" of some scientific magazines such as *Industrial and Corporate Change* and *History of Economic Ideas*. He has also been lecturer in many international conferences and workshops. He co-operates with several research groups in Italy and abroad, including the Universities of Michigan, Stanford, UCLA, and the Xerox Palo Alto Research Center (all in the US) and the University of Amsterdam (The Netherlands). He is a member of the Società Italiana degli Economisti, the European Economic Society, and the European Association of Evolutionary Economics.

Professor Egidi's main research areas include: Computable Economics, Organizational learning, Bounded rationality approach to economic behaviour, Theory of expectations and procedural rationality.
